

From the Pastor's Desk

The readings of this weekend remind us that we have finally reached the Fifth Sunday of Lent. Holy Week is not too far away. During these Lenten days, all Christians have been doing penance and fasting. We would consider it to be normal for a good Christian, during this season, to try to live as Christ asks us to live in today's Gospel. The norm to follow is of the grain of wheat that is transformed and gives much fruit. It would be a pity if we allowed these days of Lent to pass without trying to live out a more spirit filled life. Yet, at the same time, we should remember that if the grain of wheat does not die first, it remains just a grain of wheat; it is not transformed into something new.

In the Gospel Reading, Saint John tells us that Jesus already knows that he will die and that he is preparing himself for that event. But he also knows that, with his death, a new people will be born, what today, we call the universal Church. Many people talk about Jesus as if he were radically different from us. They say that he could stand the pain of the crucifixion because he was God. But Jesus was not like that. In his human nature, Jesus had all of the problems and pains that we have. He was like us in everything but sin. That is why he probably feared death, just as much as we do. The Greeks who came to talk to Jesus during the feast of the Passover in Jerusalem got to hear very human words of Our Lord. Jesus did not believe that the Cross signified failure. But that does not mean that he was not afraid of it, just as we would be. This is understandable because crucifixion meant unimaginable suffering.

We also have to suffer in this life, but in reality the crosses we are called to carry are much smaller than Jesus' cross. Yet, we are called to bear our crosses with the same patience and courage. We should understand that it is better to accept suffering, as it comes, because we all have to carry our cross for better or for worse. Many Christians refuse to accept any sacrifice that they are asked to make. They say: “As long as I'm living, I want to live well.” With that idea in mind they completely separate themselves from God, try to take advantage of others, and try to make as much money as possible without worrying where it comes from. They seem to have an incredible need to live life as they wish without taking into consideration the consequences of what they do for themselves or for others. But this way of living is not exactly what God asks of us.

Saint Paul, in the Second Reading, tells us that even though Christ was God, he lived in this world and took on a human nature, and because of this he learned about

the suffering that is part of life. This is what we do. We learn to live because of the challenges we go through. We learn that if we want to follow Jesus, we have to take up our cross, just as he did

My friends, our faith should show us that if we want to dedicate ourselves totally to Christ, we have to make a firm commitment to follow him. Only in this way, will the grain of wheat that is our spiritual life give fruit. We also heard in the Gospel reading what we need to do to allow this to happen in our life. Whoever loves his life loses it and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Let's keep this in mind as we continue our Lenten journey.

We have almost reached the end of our Lenten journey and our school family of faith is preparing to enter Holy Week.



On Tuesday we celebrated a beautiful school mass attended by Grades 3,4, and 5. Please enjoy the pictures from their liturgy.

Dear Religious Education Families,

Praying the Stations of the Cross—alone or with a group—is a Lenten tradition. Read and pray these stations very slowly. Imagine the scene in Jerusalem as Jesus walked his Way of the Cross. Often, the Stations of the Cross is an action prayer. Catholics walk to the fourteen stations of the Way of the Cross and stop to pray at each one. We invite you to reflect on these stations together as a family. Here is a great video going through the Stations of the Cross: <https://bit.ly/3rRWj11>



STATIONS OF THE CROSS

- Jesus is condemned to death.** Jesus was accused of many crimes he didn't commit. He didn't defend himself. He knew he needed to die for our sins.
- Jesus accepts the cross.** The cross was big and heavy. It was hard for Jesus to carry it. Jesus carried the heavy cross without complaining once.
- Jesus falls the first time.** Jesus was already badly wounded when he fell the first time. It must have hurt very much. Jesus got up and kept on going.
- Jesus meets his mother.** Jesus knew that his mother was sad to see him suffering so much. But he was so happy she came to him. Mary loved Jesus very much.
- Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus.** Simon didn't come to help Jesus but to see what was going on. Then he was ordered by the soldiers to carry the cross, because Jesus was having such a hard time.
- Veronica wipes Jesus' face.** Veronica loved Jesus very much. When she stepped out to wipe his face, she risked getting in big trouble from the soldiers. Her love and kindness overcame her fear.
- Jesus falls a second time.** Jesus fell again because he was so weak and tired from all his wounds. He still didn't give up. He got back up and continued on.
- Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem.** A lot of people were against Jesus, but a lot of people followed him. They were his faithful friends.
- Jesus falls a third time.** It's unbelievable that Jesus fell again and the soldiers didn't help him. They only yelled louder for him to get up and continue on. Jesus didn't get mad at them; he forgave them.
- Jesus is stripped of his clothes.** To be without clothes in front of everyone is a humiliating thing. Jesus wasn't ashamed because he knew his Father in heaven loved him and everyone who was there.
- Jesus is crucified.** The soldiers drove nails through Jesus' hands and feet. They lifted up the cross and put it in place. Jesus was in a lot of pain.
- Jesus dies on the cross.** When Jesus died, the sky got dark and the ground started to shake. This made some people very scared. They saw that Jesus was innocent and that they had made a big mistake.
- Jesus' body is taken down from the cross.** Joseph of Arimathea gave Jesus his own burial cave because Jesus didn't have a place to be buried. Joseph was another one of Jesus' friends who took a risk to help him.
- Jesus is laid in the tomb.** Even when things look very difficult and sad, there is always hope that God can bring new life.

Renew My Church → New Evangelization Team for SSCM & St. James Mission

Spiritual Renewal is the ultimate goal of the Renew My Church Program; that is, to have parishes full of members enlivened by the Holy Spirit, witnessing their Catholic faith, and sharing the message of salvation with everyone for generations to come. To foster this culture of evangelization within all parish ministries, the Archdiocese asks each new parish reality to select an Evangelization Coordinator and an Evangelization Team. Our team will consist of 10-15 members of St. Cyril & Methodius and St. James Mission combined.

To lead this Evangelization Team, we are adding to our part-time staff Coleen Mast, an experienced evangelist and catechist who joined our parish this past year. Coleen is an International Speaker, Author, Professional Life Coach, and Radio Host on EWTN Global Catholic Radio Network. She hosts a national call-in advice show, “Mast Appeal” on Saturday mornings, bringing thousands of people closer to Christ in their everyday life choices. Coleen holds a Master’s Degree, four teaching specialties, and an Honorary Doctorate Degree in Humane Letters for her writings on the human person. She has served two terms as an advisory to the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, as well as for the Vatican Pontifical Council for the Family in Rome under Pope St. John Paul II. Coleen and her husband, Kent have five grown children.

The most important aspect of evangelization and spiritual renewal for our parish is your prayers. Let us join together asking God to help us grow our faith and give us opportunities to share his message of love, forgiveness, and salvation in Jesus Christ, so that we can make ‘His Kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven.’

The Archdiocesan Office of Evangelization and Missionary Discipleship has organized various resources and training programs for us to utilize to build an ongoing spiritual renewal and culture of evangelization that will be durable and last for decades.

Try designating days this week for a more contemplative state, giving up buying “stuff”, and pre-purchasing only the minimum essentials.

Drodzy Parafianie,

Czytania dzisiejszej niedzieli przypominają nam, że dotarliśmy do piątej niedzieli Wielkiego Postu i zbliżamy się do Wielkiego Tygodnia. Podczas tych dni Wielkiego Postu, wszyscy chrześcijanie pokutowali i pościli. Uważamy, że jest to normalne, aby dobrzy chrześcijanie właśnie w tym okresie czasu żyli tak jak Chrystus prosi nas w dzisiejszej Ewangelii. Wzorcem do naśladowania jest ziarno pszenicy, które obumierając przynosi obfity plon. Byłoby wielką szkodą gdybyśmy przegapili mijające dni Wielkiego Postu i nie próbowali duchowo się przygotować. Musimy również pamiętać, że gdyby ziarno pszenicy pierwsze nie obumarło, to pozostałoby tylko ziarnem pszenicy i nie przemieniłoby się w coś nowego.

W Ewangelii, Święty Jan mówi nam, że Jezus już wie o swojej śmierci i przygotowuje się na to wydarzenie. Jezus również wie, że przez Jego śmierć narodzą się nowi ludzie, co dzisiaj nazywamy Kościołem Powszechnym. Wielu ludzi mówi o Jezusie jakby zasadniczo różnił się od nas. Mówią, że mógł wytrzymać ból ukrzyżowania, ponieważ był Bogiem, ale tak nie było. W swojej ludzkiej naturze, Jezus miał takie same problemy i bóle jakie i my mamy. Był podobny do nas we wszystkim oprócz grzechu. Prawdopodobnie dlatego obawiał się śmierci tak samo jak my. Grecy, którzy przyszli do Jerozolimy w święto Paschy, aby porozmawiać z Jezusem, mogli usłyszeć ludzkie słowa Naszego Pana. Jezus nie wierzył, że Krzyż oznacza upadek, ale nie znaczyło to, że się nie lękał. Lękał się tak samo jak my i to jest całkowicie zrozumiałe, ponieważ ukrzyżowanie oznaczało niewyobrażalne cierpienie.

W naszym życiu my również mamy cierpienia, ale prawdą jest, że krzyż, który zostaliśmy powołani nieść, jest dużo mniejszy niż krzyż Jezusa. Zostaliśmy powołani, aby nieść nasze krzyże z taką samą cierpliwością i odwagą. Powinniśmy zrozumieć, że lepiej jest przyjąć cierpienie, które na nas przychodzi, gdyż wszyscy musimy nieść swoje krzyże na dobre czy na złe. Wielu chrześcijan nie chce wziąć na siebie wyrzeczeń, o które są proszeni. Mówią: "Jak długo żyję, chcę żyć dobrze wygodnie." Żyjąc z tą myślą, całkowicie odzielają się od Boga próbując wykorzystywać innych i próbując zarobić jak najwięcej pieniędzy nie zważając skąd pochodzą. Wydaje się, że mają nieodpartą potrzebę życia, tak samo jak nie chcą wziąć pod uwagę konsekwencji swojego postępowania. Ten sposób życia nie jest dokładnie taki, do jakiego wzywa nas Bóg.

W drugim czytaniu, Święty Paweł mówi nam, że pomimo to, że Chrystus był Bogiem, żył na tym świecie i przyjął ludzką naturę, poznał co znaczy cierpienie, które jest częścią naszego życia. Uczymy się żyć dzięki wezwaniom, które musimy przejść. Uczymy się, że jeśli chcemy naśladować Jezusa, to musimy tak jak On wziąć swój krzyż. Przyjaciele! Nasza wiara powinna wskazać nam, że jeśli chcemy całkowicie poświęcić się Chrystusowi, musimy zrobić szczere postanowienie naśladowania Go. Jedynie w ten sposób ziarno przenicy symbolizujące nasze życie duchowe wyda plon.

W dzisiejszej Ewangelii słyszeliśmy również co musimy zrobić, aby tak się stało. Ten, kto miłuje swoje życie, traci je, a kto nienawidzi swego życia na tym świecie, zachowa je na życie wieczne. Zachowajmy te słowa w pamięci, kontynuując czas Wielkiego Postu.

- W tyle kościoła umieszczone zostały tzw. „Ryżowe Miseczki” wielkopostnej jałmużny. Wasza ofiara pomaga biednym i głodnym. Dziękujemy za Waszą darowiznę.
- Poświęć tylko godzinę swojego czasu Jezusowi i zapisz się na adorację w Kaplicy Bożego Miłosierdzia. Mamy nadal wolne miejsca.
- Po weekendowych Mszach Św. 14 i 21 marca będziemy sprzedawać plakaty Miłosierdzia Bożego. Więcej informacji w biuletynie.
- Organizacja Pomocne Dłonie będzie dostarczać artykuły spożywcze potrzebującym rodzinom w celu zapewnienia im śniadania wielkanocnego i obiadu. Zapraszamy po więcej informacji do biuletynu gdzie znajdują się informacje odnośnie rejestracji i pomocy potrzebującym podczas Wielkiego Postu.


