From the Associate Pastor's Desk
Dear Parishioners,
Part III

To conclude the amazing story of Scotland's loss of the Catholic faith in the wake of the "Reformation" we pick up our hero, "Queen Mary

of Scotland" and our villain, William Cecil. By 1566, the "reformer" John Knox was advocating his new pastoral plan to spread Protestantism; His plan was simple: either the Queen converts to Protestantism or will chop her head off. But many Catholics in Scotland still loved and supported her. And since she needed a good Catholic husband to help her rule, she declared she would not marry a Protestant.

William Cecil had a plan. King Henry VIII's sister, Margaret had a handsome 18 year old son, Henry Stuart, aka; Lord Darnley. Since he grew up in London and was already known to be a weak Catholic, if Mary would marry him, and Mary could be gotten rid of, Scotland would easily give up its Catholic heritage. Mary falls for the handsome prince, but is cautious to give him the "crown matrimonial". William Cecil, then plants the rumor that Mary is having an affair with her secretary David Riccio, who was well known as a defender of Catholicism. Lord Darnley, believes this rumor and even accepts a plot to have Riccio killed.

At a private dinner party, a giant of a man, Ruthven, who is dying of an illness, rushes at Riccio, who is providing music for the party and stabs him to death. Mary is furious of course and accuses her husband of trying to cause a miscarriage of her unborn child, who would of course be next in line to the throne if Darnley was not "officially king". Darnley, the next day, regrets his part in the murder, asks for Mary's forgiveness and she grants it. They decide they both must escape. Riding fast away from their home, Darnley screams "Faster, faster". Mary, being six months pregnant says, I can't go any faster. Darnley, rides ahead, and Mary eventually meets up with him.

So, what's the take away from this story of long ago? Well, it shows us, when it comes to the evangelization and promotion of the faith, we need to be cautious of those who have it in for Catholicism. It's important to recall Our Lord's words, "Those who are not with us are against us."

So, today, similar situations can be found. Namely, weak Catholics who are manipulated by strong willed anti-Catholics are a significant reason the Church falls into corruption and "tribalism". We must all pray for strength to live our faith and see how even some Catholics are helping the anti-Catholic forces in society today.



Z biurka wikariusza pastora
Drodzy Parafianie,
Part III
Aby zakończyć niesamowitą historię
utraty wiary katolickiej przez
Szkocję w następstwie „reformacji”,
przedstawiamy naszą bohaterkę,
„Królową Szkocji, Marię” i naszego złoczyńcę,
Williama Cecila. W 1566 roku „reformator” John
Knox popierał swój nowy plan duszpasterskiego
szerzenia protestantyzmu. Jego strategia była prosta,
królowa przejdzie na protestantyzm albo odetnie jej
głowę. Silną stroną królowej był fakt, że wielu
katolików w Szkocji nadal ją kochalo i wspieralo.
A ponieważ potrzebowała dobrego katolickiego męża,
który pomogłby jej rządzić, oświadczyła, że nie
poślubi protestanta.

William Cecil miał już swój plan. Siostra króla Henryka VIII, Margaret, miała przystojnego 18-letniego syna, Henry'ego Stuarta; Lorda Darnleya, który dorastał w Londynie i niestety był już znany jako słaby katolik. Dlatego gdyby Mary poślubiła go, wtedy z łatwością Szkocja zrezygnowałaby ze swojego katolickiego dziedzictwa. Maria zakochuje się w przystojnym księciu, ale jest ostrożna i nie oddaje mu „małżeńskiej korony”. Wówczas William Cecil rozsiewa plotkę, że Maria ma romans ze swoim sekretarzem Davide Riccio, który był znany jako zdecydowany obrońca katolicyzmu. Lord Darnley uwierzył w tę plotkę, a nawet zrodził pomysł spisku mający na celu zabicie Riccio.

Podczas prywatnej kolacji gigantyczny, nieuleczalnie chory mężczyzna, Ruthven, wpada na Riccio i dżga go na śmierć nożem. Mary jest oczywiście wściekła i oskarża męża o próbę poronienia jej nienarodzonego dziecka, które oczywiście byłoby następne w kolejce do tronu, gdyby Darnley nie pozostał „oficjalnie królem”. Darnley następnego dnia żaluje swojego udziału w morderstwie i prosi Marie o przebaczenie, które otrzymuje. Postanawiają razem, że oboje muszą uciec. Jadąc szybko z dala od domu, Darnley krzyczy „Szybciej, szybciej”. Mary, będąc w szóstym miesiącu ciąży, mówi, że nie może już jechać szybciej. Darnley jedzie przed siebie, a Maria w końcu go dogania.

Więc jaki jest wniosek z tej dawnej historii? Otóż, pokazuje nam, że jeżeli chodzi o ewangelizację i promowanie wiary, musimy być bardzo ostrożni wobec tych, którzy stoją po stronie katolicyzmu. Ważne jest, aby przypomnieć słowa naszego Pana:

„Ci, którzy nie są z nami, są przeciwko nam”. Tak więc dzisiaj można znaleźć podobne sytuacje. Mianowicie, słabi katolicy, którymi manipulują antykatolicy o silnej woli, są istotnym powodem, dla którego Kościół popada w korupcję. Wszyscy musimy modlić się o siłę, aby żyć naszą wiarą i zobaczyć, jak niektórzy katolicy przez swoją bezmyślność pomagają dziś antykatolickim siłom w społeczeństwie.
